



Part-time Online CELTA FAQs

1. How long does it take to complete the CELTA course?

10 weeks part-time: 120 hours minimum

2. How many participants on each course?

There is a maximum of 12 trainee teachers on each course, and 2 tutors.

3. What does a typical week of the CELTA course involve?

- Online self-paced work in the CELTA online platform (Moodle).
- You should do 3 units per week online, which is about 10 hours per week.
- Teaching practice, feedback, lesson planning is Tuesday and Thursday evenings in Zoom 5pm-8.30pm Adelaide time.
- Lesson planning draft facility: trainees can send in a draft of their plan to be checked each week. Allow 2 hours for lesson planning each week.

4. Does the 100% online course qualify me to teach face-to-face as well as online?

Yes, you will learn teaching techniques that can be used onsite and online. The skills you learn for teaching online will help in this increasingly popular mode of teaching.

5. Who will the other trainees be?

The other trainees will be from a variety of different backgrounds and professions. Like you they will be eligible for the CELTA and will have been through the interview process.

6. How will I be assessed?

Assessment is continuous through the course. You will be assessed during teaching practice during the course and your written assignments will also be assessed.

7. How is the course monitored by Cambridge University?

On every CELTA course, as Cambridge approved assessor checks the course standard. On the online course, the assessor will check the lesson plans and written work you have produced. They will also attend one teaching practice session online in Week 9 of the course, to see that is running in accordance with Cambridge guidelines.

8. What happens after the course?

After successful completion of the course you will be qualified to teach English as a Second Language anywhere in the world, including Australia. SACE will support you by providing advice on how to look for and apply for jobs.
